had an elliptical stern. This image dates from around 1913.


Torbay's seafront Pavilion and Princess Gardens are showcased in the 1913 picture.

The crew of 'Collie' in 1913, the first Brixham trawler said to have had an elliptical stern.




The Pavilion and Princess Gardens in 1913
